## **INTRODUCTION**

Vidhi Mahavidyalaya, Samastipur is situated in the heart of Samastipur town just in the south of S. Vijay Raghwan Stadium (Patel Maidan). The distance of Civil Court, Collectorate, Sadar Hospital, Railway Station and Bus Stand are situated within walking distance of about 5 minutes. There are seven Degree Colleges situated within radius of ½ KM to 1 KM of the college.

This college endeavours to prepare able, responsible and competent professionals in legal world who can preserve and strengthen our social and cultural heritage and uphold the principles of truth and justice. They are expected to bring justice and peace in the society through their legal expertise. This college, therefore, has been trying to inculcate in its students a sense of responsibility towards society and nation as well as global under changing economical, Political and legal regime.

In the year 1978 a meeting was convened by eminent lawyers, social workers and educationist of Samastipur district at the residence of Sri Suraj Narain Prasad Sinha, Advocate, Samastipur to establish a law college at Samastipur. The meeting was presided by Sri Sheo Chandra Prasad Rajgrihar and was unaninously resolved to establish a law college named as Vidhi Mahavidyalaya in Samastipur town. It was also resolved that there shall be a seven men committee to run the college and accordingly (1) Sri Suraj Narain Prasad Sinha (2) Sri Sheo Chandra Prasad Rajgrihar (3) Sri Parmanand Choudhary (4) Dr. Harbansh Tarun (5) Sri Ramakant Mishra (6) Sri Ram Bilas Rai and (7) Sri Bhola Prasad Sah were made members of the managing committee.

It was also resolved that Sri Parmanand Choudhary, Advocate will be the Professor-Incharge of the college and Sri Suraj Narain Prasad Sinha, Advocate will be the convenor of the committee. On 09.09.1978 the college was inaugurated by the then Education Minister of Government of Bihar Md. Gulam Sarvar and in this way Vidhi Mahavidyalaya, Samastipur came into existence.

### Eligibility for admission

An applicant who has graduated in any discipline of knowledge from a university established by an Act of Parliament or by a state legislative or equivalent national institution recognized as a Deemed to be university or foreign university recognised as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by an authority competent to declare equivalence in law, with a minimum percentage of marks not below 45% in total marks in case of general category applicants, 42% for OBC and 40% of the total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.

- 1. Attested photocopies of original documents of Matriculation, Intermediate and Graduation certificates and marks-sheets.
- 2. Original college leaving certificate (CLC/DLC)
- 3. Original Migration certificate in case of candidate coming from other than L.N.M.U Darbhanga.
- 4. Three copies of recent passport size photograph.

## **CODE OF CONDUCT**

The Vidhi Mahavidyalaya administration is committed to maintain discipline in the campus. The following rules and regulations failing which a suitable action will be taken.

- The college will issue an Identity Card to all the bonafide students. The students are required to carry their Identity Cards which must be produced if demanded by the authority.

## PRACTICAL TRAINING

Paper - I Moot Court 100 Marks

Moot Court, Pre-trial preparation and participation in Trial Proceeding

This paper will have three components of 30 marks each and a Viva for 10 marks.

- A. Moot Court 30 Marks Every Students will do atleast three Moot Courts with 10 marks each. The Moot Courts works - work will be assigned problems and it will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submission and 5 marks for oral advocacy.
- B. Observation of Trial in Two Cases One Civil & One Criminal 30 Marks Student will attend two trial in the course. They will maintain Daily Diary and inter the various steps observed during the attendance of different days in the court assignment. This scheme will carry 30 marks.
- C. Interviewing technique and pre-trial preparation 30 Marks
  Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the
  Advocate and the procedure for filling of suit/petition will be recorded in the diary which
  will be carry 15 marks
- D. The fourth components of this paper will be Viva-Voce examination on all the above three subjects. This will carry 10 marks.
