- A. Moot Court 30 Marks

Every Students will do atleast three Moot Courts with 10 marks each.

The Moot Courts works - work will be assigned problems and it will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submission and 5 marks for oral advocacy.

- B. **Observation of Trial in Two Cases - One Civil & One Criminal** 30 Marks

Student will attend two trial in the course. They will maintain Dally Diary and inter the various steps observed during the attendance of different days in the court assignment.

This scheme will carry 30 marks.

- C. Interviewing technique and pre-trial preparation 30 Marks

Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for filling of suit/petition will be recorded in the diary which will be carry 15 marks

- D. The fourth components of this paper will be Viva-Voce examination on all the above three subjects. This will carry 10 marks.

Paper - II Drafting, Pleading and Conveyancing

This course will be taught through class instruction and simultation exercise preferably with assistance of practicing of law, lawyers/retired judges, apart from teaching the relevant provisions of law, the course will include 15 exercises in drafting carrying a total of 45 marks and exercises in conveyancing another 45 marks (3 marks for each exercise)

This course carrying 100 marks will have to be designed and evaluated according to local conditions by the college in consultation with the universities and State Bar Councils. It can be taught partly through class room instructions including simultaneous exercises and partly through extension programmes like Lok Adalat, Legal Aid Camp, Legal Literacy and Para Legal Training. The course should also contain lesson on negotiations and counselling, use of computer in legal works, legal research in support of public interest litigation, writing of case comments, editing of law journals and law office management. The marks may be appropriately divided to the different programmes that each university might evolve for introduction in the colleges under its control
